

# FUTURE REAL CONDITIONALS

## FUTURE SPECIFIC SITUATIONS (FIRST CONDITIONAL)

**If it rains, I'll stay at home.**

(Normally: if + present simple (with a future meaning), will + infinitive.)

In the

### IF-CLAUSE

we can also use:

#### the present continuous

If it's raining at 10 am, I'll stay at home.

#### can / may / must

If I can, I'll come at 10am.

#### should / happen to / both + inversion

If it happens to rain, I'll stay at home.  
Should it rain, I'll stay at home.

#### will / won't with modal meaning

If he won't help, I won't either.

In the

### MAIN CLAUSE

we can also use:

#### be going to

If it rains, I'm going to stay at home.

#### the imperative

If it rains, take your umbrella.

#### modals (not would)

If it rains, I might stay at home.

#### the future perfect

If we don't hurry, the film will have started.
